

April 2024 Monthly Meeting

The monthly meeting for the Town of Casco was called to order by Chairman Joe Lukes on Monday, April 29, at 7:00 pm. Present were Jeremy, Kari, and Kiley Heim, Pat Benes, Randy and Jordan Ebert, and all members of the Casco Town Board.

The clerk read the minutes from the March meeting. Barry made a motion to approve the minutes as read and Perry seconded. Motion approved.

The treasurer reported as follows: Checking-\$382,221.34 Cemetery-\$122.39 ARPA-\$87,116.07
Checking CD-\$52,333.18 Cemetery CD-\$4,032.18 D.O.I.- General Transportation Aid-\$31,215.44
Lottery Credit-\$9,753.87 PILT-\$2,084.47 Joe asked Peggy about the Local Government Investment Pool through the Bank of Luxemburg for investment of funds. Peggy said she was unaware of it, but would look into it. Perry made a motion to approve the report and Barry seconded. Motion approved.

Edie reported on a zoning hearing on April 9. Heim's Hillcrest Dairy wants to rezone 2 acres for their daughter to build a home. This was approved unanimously by the Planning Commission. Perry made a motion to approve the rezone and Barry seconded. Motion carried.

The board will appoint Board of Appeals members at the May meeting.

Randy Ebert talked about the house he owns on Highway 54. Joe said that someone texted him concerned about the number of people living there. Randy explained that it is an 8 bedroom home and 7 people currently live there. He checked with Lonnie Van Goethem as to the septic system. He will check with the county if it is adequate for the number of bedrooms and replace if necessary. The property is currently zoned A-2.

Letters were sent to residents informing them of issues with garbage being placed in recycling bins. Owners are instructed to relay this to tenants who may not understand this.

All bills were approved and paid. There are no outstanding bills.

Joe stated that Jadin put 38 loads of recycled blacktop on Pine Lane. Joe and Perry inspected roads earlier to see where the greatest needs exist for summer roadwork.

Luxemburg and Kewaunee fire departments will be purchasing new fire trucks. The ARPA fund will help with some of the cost.

The county board has 3 new supervisors since the April election. Dan Olsen was re-elected as chairman.

The next town's association meeting will be held on Monday, May 20, at Rankin Church.

The next town meeting will be held on Tuesday, May 28, at 7:00 pm. Barry made a motion to adjourn and Perry seconded. Meeting adjourned at 8:00 pm.
